Part 1: WHERE DID IT BEGIN?

God asked, "What is this you have done?" Genesis 3:13

Narration - Vicar Strucely

Recitation (Grade 7-8)

Close your eyes and picture a mother walking into a child's bedroom only to find that her three year old daughter has just given herself a haircut. The floor is covered with dark locks of hair, and her head is covered with bare spots. Would you blame the mother for exclaiming, "What is this you have done?" Those few words sum up her anger, frustration, and disappointment in the child.

Now picture the Almighty God looking you in the eye and asking you, "What is this you have done?" No doubt those words would cause your knees to shake. Hearing God voice his anger, frustration, and disappointment in you sounds frightening. Yet those are the exact words he spoke to Eve after she had eaten of the forbidden fruit. God gave Adam and Eve everything they could ever wish for in their new home.

Genesis 1:31, "God saw all that he had made, and it was very good."

But they were also given a will to do as they pleased. They could remain in perfect harmony with their Father, or they could pursue other paths. Sadly, they chose to follow Satan.

Genesis 3:6 "When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye, and also desirable for gaining wisdom, she took some and ate it. She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it."

And God asked the question, "What is this you have done?"

The sin was committed. The perfect life was over. The perfect gifts God had given would now become tainted with sin. Life would be difficult, and death would surely follow.

But God's love wasn't spoiled. God promised Adam and Eve that he would come to their rescue.

Genesis 3:15 "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Do you know who would crush Satan's head? It was Jesus. He would come to the rescue. He would take on himself the anger and punishment of God's wrath. So we ask the question again, where did it all begin?

Part 2: HOW DID THE NEWS SPREAD?

Isaiah asked, "Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?" Isaiah 53:1

Narration – Vicar Strucely

Recitation (*Grades 1-6*)

Isaiah 53:1 "Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

Spoken Recitation: "The Questions"

(Grades 1-2): How can it be that the prophets of old
Could possibly claim all the things that they said?
How could these writers have ever foretold
The birthday of Jesus, his life and his death?

How can it be that a maiden so pure Was chosen to mother this most Holy One? Since Gabriel told her that she could be sure Jehovah was Father, Messiah was Son?

Congregation: How can it be? Please won't you tell?

(Grades 3-4): How can it be that some shepherds one night
While resting quite calmly with sheep bedded down
Saw thousands of angels in raiment so bright
Proclaiming the Good News o'er Bethlehem town?

How can it be that our God had such love To come down from heaven for someone like me? So one day I'd join him in heaven above To spend not a lifetime, but eternity?

Congregation: How can it be? Please won't you tell?

(Grades 5-6): I'll tell you clearly just how it can be:
God's love has no boundaries, beginning or end,
In Bethlehem's manger for you and for me
There laid our Redeemer, our Savior, our Friend.

How then was the news foretold? Through the promises of old. From age to age the word had spread What God's great messengers had said.

Part 3: WHEN DID THE MIRACLE HAPPEN?

Mary asked, "How will this be since I am a virgin?" Luke 1:34

Narration - Vicar Strucely

Recitation (Grades 5-6)

Galatians 4:4-5 "When the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship."

It began in Nazareth, a tiny village in northern Palestine, where a simple woman named Mary was engaged to a young man named Joseph. One day, as she was carrying out her daily chores, God's messenger angel Gabriel came to her and told her:

Luke 1:31-32 "You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High."


But Mary was startled and confused. So she asked the angel this question:

Luke 1:34 "How will this be" Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

Luke 1:35 "The angel answered, 'The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God."

And Gabriel continued to tell her that God the Father and God the Holy Spirit would work miracles in her because with God nothing is impossible. What a wonderful beginning to the miracle of Christmas. Jesus was to be both the Son of Man, and the very Son of God.

- 1. (1-8)The angel Gabriel from heaven came, His wings as drifted snow, his eyes as flame; "All hail," said he to meek and lowly Mary, "Most highly favored maiden." Gloria!
- (1-8) "I come from heav'n to tell the Lord's decree:
 A blessed virgin mother you shall be.
 Your Son shall be Immanuel, by seers foretold,
 Most highly favored maiden." Gloria!
- 3. (1-8)Then gentle Mary meekly bowed her head;"To me be as it pleases God," she said."My soul shall praise and magnify his holy name."Most highly favored maiden. Gloria!





Recitation:

(3-4)How did God get Mary and Joseph from Nazareth to Bethlehem? What happened the night Jesus was born? God's plan came to earth when Jesus was placed in the womb of Mary. From that point on, Jesus lived his life as a man. He felt pain, needed to eat and rest, shed tears, and became tired. His heart ached as he experienced every part of our lives. And it all began in the manger in Bethlehem on that Christmas night so long ago. That's where we can find the King of all people. This is how it happened.

Luke 2:1-12

(3-4) In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.

(K-2) While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.

(K-2)When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

Hymn: "Silent Night! Holy Night!" (with Calvary alumni) CW60

Alumni are asked to walk forward with their candles and disperse along the two side aisles during the prelude to "Silent Night." A faculty member will initiate candle lighting in each aisle and alumni are asked to carefully continue the lighting of candles down the aisle during "Silent Night." When the song is complete, please blow out your candles as you walk back to your seats. Please place your candles in the box in the narthex at the end of the service.

(3-4) So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

(Grades 1-2): When did God's great plan unfold?
With the words that Gabriel told.
Thus began God's saving story
That would show God's awesome glory.

Part 4: WHY DID JESUS COME AT CHRISTMAS TIME?

Why are you so afraid? (Matthew 8:26)

Do you believe that I am able to do this? (Matthew 9:28)

Why did you doubt? (Matthew 14:31)

How many loaves do you have? (Matthew 15:34)

Who touched my clothes? (Mark 5:30)

Couldn't you keep watch for one hour? (Mark 14:37)

Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house? (Luke 2:49)

Why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for? (John 20:15)

- (7-8) Perhaps the gravest question our Savior ever asked was on Good Friday when he looked up from his cross to heaven and cried out loud:
- (5-6) Matthew 27:46 "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
- (7-8) Those words summed up Jesus life and death. His own Father had forsaken him so he could bear our sins and accept all the punishment that was ours. How can we ever thank him? And that's why Jesus asked this question of the travelers on the road to Emmaus: Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?
- (Grades 5-6): You ask why all this came to be In Bethlehem's nativity? God sent his holy, sinless Son That he might rescue everyone.
