

"He makes his angels winds, his servants flames of fire."


⁸But about the Son he says,





CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Athanasian Creed: Part 1

It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh. Now this is the true Christian faith:

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh, equal to the Father as to his deity, less than the Father as to his humanity;

and though he is both God and Man, Christ is not two persons but one, one, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God;

one, indeed, not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person; for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead. He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

At his coming all people will rise with their own bodies to answer for their personal deeds. Those who have done good will enter eternal life, but those who have done evil will go into eternal fire.

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

Family of God, Christ our Savior is born and our salvation has been revealed, in keeping with the promises made so long ago.

Oh, come, let us adore him.

Lord God, Father of us all, You provided Your Son an earthly mother to bear and provide for Him. You instructed Joseph to take Mary as his wife, and thus to provide for Jesus' physical needs. Thank You for the gift of parents, who serve as "masks" of Your loving care. Bless all parents everywhere with the wisdom, the patience, the love and the good humor they need to train their children in the way they should go. We ask it in the name of the newborn King:

Oh, come, let us adore him.

Lord of the nations, the psalmist says, "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord". We are Your people, and You have made us citizens of a nation that is so richly blessed in so many ways. We pray for the leaders of our country; give them wise and discerning hearts. May they make, administer and interpret our laws in keeping with Your will. We ask it in the name of Jesus, who is the King of kings: **Oh, come, let us adore him.**

It is true, dear God, that even after 2,000 years, many people still live as enemies of the truth of the Gospel. We who are here today may not be able to reach huge numbers of people, but we *can* reach out to the ones who live and work around us. Make us willing, Father. King David said, "O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise" (Ps. 51:15); do the same for us today! Bring the lost to faith in Jesus Christ. He is the Savior of the *world*:

Oh, come, let us adore him.

Lord Jesus, many of Your followers are being brutally persecuted — even killed — because they will not deny their faith. They suffer so much, and their boldness and courage are an incredible testimony that can even lead their persecutors to believe in You and be saved! Watch over them, Lord. Bless them with Your presence even in the darkest times. Give them the strength to endure, and inspire us through their sufferings, so that we are willing to serve You too. Preserve Your Church, O God, until that day when every knee will bow and every tongue confess, "Jesus Christ is Lord:

Oh, come, let us adore him."

Into Your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in Your mercy, through Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.


