THE WORD

FIRST LESSON Jeremiah 31:31-34

Nothing that Jesus suffers is because of his own guilt, rather in humility he bears the New Covenant of forgiveness for our sins. Already in Jeremiah's day the prophet could see the glory of that New Covenant enacted by God's grace.

SECOND LESSON Hebrews 5:7-9

Out of love for us, the Father did not answer Jesus' cries at once, nor did Jesus cut short his time of anguish because he did not want us to suffer what he suffered. By patient endurance and humiliation, he became our perfect Savior.

HEBREWS 5:7 During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸ Although he was a son, he learned obedience from what he suffered ⁹ and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.

VERSE OF THE DAY

The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many. (Mark 10:45 cf. NIV)

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

After the announcement of the Gospel the congregation responds:



GOSPEL John 12:20-33

Jesus makes these three astonishing announcements: His glory begins with his humiliation; he has come to suffer; he has come to die! As troubling as those sound, Jesus looks forward to the fruit of his Passion – that by the cross he might draw us to himself.

JOHN 12:20 Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the Feast. ²¹ They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. “Sir,” they said, “we would like to see Jesus.” ²² Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus.

²³ Jesus replied, “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ I tell you the truth, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. ²⁵ The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ Whoever

serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me.

²⁷ “Now my heart is troubled, and what shall I say? ‘Father, save me from this hour’? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name!”

Then a voice came from heaven, “I have glorified it, and will glorify it again.” ²⁹ The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him.

³⁰ Jesus said, “This voice was for your benefit, not mine. ³¹ Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. ³² But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself.” ³³ He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.
